OLD TESTAMENT COMMENTARY

Old Testament readings for the preceding Sundays have provided us with a brief extract from the Bible's story of sinful humanity (First Sunday), followed by God's resolve to heal humanity through the call of Abraham Israel's ancestor (Second Sunday), the subsequent struggle of the people under Moses' leadership (Third Sunday), and the great promise of king David (Fourth Sunday), a promise that the books of Kings tell us was only briefly realised. Israel was exiled to Babylon in the 6th century BC. To an observer this must have looked like the end but for God there is no end and God never gives up on the chosen people. This Sunday's passage from the book of the exilic prophet Ezekiel proclaims God's resolve to raise the people from the graveyard of defeat and exile. The first part of the book reaffirms the pre-exilic prophets' condemnation of Israel's disobedience and its consequences. This needed to be stated otherwise the theology of a good God who is intolerant of evil is compromised. But, the purpose of God's intervention against evil is to restore right relationships between God and the people and between the people themselves. This is a key thrust of the second part of Ezekiel, including

Our passage is part of an imaginative series of visions that permeate the book of Ezekiel. Living in exile far from Jerusalem, the prophet's visionary journeys enable him to 'cross' geographical boundaries and let the reader 'see' and experience the restoration of the land and city that God will bring about. The text is arranged in characteristic Hebrew form, with parallel statements about God's promise to 'open your graves/raise you from your graves' framing a central statement that highlights the purpose of God's promised intervention: it is in order that 'you will know that I am the Lord'. This text is not about resurrection in the Christian sense but restoration of the people to their land and temple. One might have expected the text to say that God will do it because God has chosen Israel and loves her, or that God is doing it for justice's sake. But, for the Bible the most important thing is to know God; it is only when we know who God is that we can know who we are and who our neighbours are, and what our role in creation is. The Bible's claim is that everything falls into place once we know God; that is, believe in God as proclaimed by the Bible and the tradition that accompanies it.

The responsorial psalm 129 (130 in Hebrew numbering) adds an important ingredient to the relationship between God and the people that is not explicit in the reading from Ezekiel. Although forgiveness of sin and restoration to a right relationship with God depends completely on God, the appropriate human response is to acknowledge one's sin. This signals that one accepts God's judgment as just and true and that any future one has depends completely on God. Hence, it is an expression of trust (faith). The psalmist here cries to God from a seemingly infinite distance ('the depths'), convinced that God can reach and transform any situation no matter how bad or desperate it may seem to be. Without such faith, there would be no point crying out to God.

In the second stanza or paragraph, the psalmist acknowledges that God is judge, but once the psalmist acknowledges the justice of God's judgments, forgiveness is given. God does not mark or hold guilt because this would demean human life rather than enhance it. On the basis of this acknowledgement, the third stanza expresses complete confidence in God's forgiveness – by way of a just and merciful judgment. A nice contrast is made with the watchman on the city wall. He knows that dawn is coming but cannot be sure what the dawn will reveal: a peaceful sight or an advancing enemy? In contrast, the psalmist is as certain of God's judgment as the dawn, but is even more certain that it will be favourable. This is the nature of God who is merciful and full of redemption to those who trust.

The final stanza combines two further elements that are not explicitly linked in Ezekiel: God's forgiveness of the individual is a manifestation of the forgiveness of Israel, and vice versa. The ancient world did not have our heightened or hyper sense of individuality. You were someone primarily because you were part of a larger family, clan or nation. You never thought of yourself independently of the larger group of which you were a part. This is why many prophecies address all Israel without any need to make a special mention of the individual or to make an exception for the individual

John 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33-45



The sisters Martha and Mary sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This

sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

'I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?'

Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'See how much he loved him!' Jesus replied, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:

'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer. I knew indeed that you always hear me, but I speak for the sake of all these who stand round me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me.'

When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, here! Come out!' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, let him go free.'
