The Good Soil

Jesus paints a very familiar picture from everyday agriculture life in Palestine and draws lesson from it. Jesus compares the word of God to seed which is intended to produce fruit in our lives. At baptism the delicate and demanding seed of the word of God is first planted in our hearts. If it doesn't get our whole-heated attention by finding a home in our lives, it withers and dies. Often when the Lord comes knocking at our door, we fail to make him welcome because we are so preoccupied with the meaningless pursuit of the moment. To be a cultivator of goodness, we must dig deep within ourselves. God does not want parttime or half-hearted followers. His word never blossoms alongside greed and selfishness. Growth in the life of Christ is not always a smooth, gradual, and straightforward process. The different type of soil can well be the varied response we make to his word, depending on the twists and turns our fortunes may take. When we meet with setbacks and disappointments, obstacles such as these, can choke our good intentions and weaken our firm resolve. Moments like these call for deep faith. No matter what the situation, we must struggle to believe.

The word of God has immense and mysterious power to change us. The hard thorny patch that we currently experience, could be Christ's way of calling us to a deeper union with him. Reaping the rich harvest of God's goodness depends on our openness to receive his word. So often, when God is sowing the seed of his love around us we are cold and too proud to allow ourselves to be won over. However, there is good soil in every human heart and given time and effort and a considerable degree of pain, the Spirit of the living God will put down deep roots in our lives, assuring us of varying degree of happiness and fulfilment in our lives.

GOSPEL

Matthew 13:1-23

Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables.

He said, 'Imagine a sower going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Others fell on rich soil and produced their crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!'

Then the disciples went up to him and asked, 'Why do you talk to them in parables?' 'Because' he replied 'the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven are revealed to you, but they are not revealed to them. For anyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. The reason I talk to them in parables is that they look without seeing and listen without hearing or understanding. So in their case this prophecy of Isaiah is being fulfilled:

You will listen and listen again, but not understand, see and see again, but not perceive. For the heart of this nation has grown coarse, their ears are dull of hearing, and they have shut their eyes, for fear they should see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their heart, and be converted and be healed by me.

'But happy are your eyes because they see, your ears because they hear! I tell you solemnly, many prophets and holy men longed to see what you see, and never saw it; to hear what you hear, and never heard it.

'You, therefore, are to hear the parable of the sower. When hears the word of the kingdom without understanding, the evil one comes and carries off what was sown in his heart: this is the man who received the seed on the edge of the path. The one who received it on patches of rock is the man who hears the word and welcomes it at once with joy. But he has no root in him, he does not last; let some trial come, or some persecution on account of the word, and he falls away at once. The one who received the seed in thorns is the man who hears the word, but the worries of this world and the lure of riches choke the word and so he produces nothing. And the one who received the seed in rich soil is the man who hears the word and understands it; he is the one who yields a harvest and produces now a hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty.'
