19th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR A

13 AUGUST 2023

The Gospel passage invites us to become aware of the power of God at work in the life of the church and in our lives besides challenging us to deepen our faith. Disciples experience a manifestation of God's presence and mighty power. As the boat is being tossed about by a severe storm, the disciples see Jesus walking on the water. The wind calms down when Iesus gets into the boat after pulling Peter out of the water. The disciples realise that they are in the presence of the Almighty and worship Jesus saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

The presence of God is manifested in many ways in our lives, usually in ways and times that we least expect. Sometimes we survive an accident and then realise that it has been God's protective hand that saves us. Sometimes, God's voice is the tiny whispering sound of our conscience that moves us into action. Sometimes they are providential storms that obligate us to push our little boat on by any means just so that it does not smash up in the shoals of hopelessness.

Saint Augustine imagines life as a voyage on the ocean, on which people are like sailors that have one desire in their hearts. Some of them are never able to leave the shore. Others go on the journey recklessly and end up losing their way. Finally others are blown off course by providential storms and risk forgetting their desired goal but manage to bring their ships back, though battered, to the peace of its desired port:

"Others, because of fog or because they are gazing at some waning star or enticed by something, leave the straight path and postpone ever setting sail." – Augustine

In this passage from the Gospel, the disciples did not decide to go on a voyage. It was Jesus who obligates them to go on and confront their fears. Jesus forces the disciples to confront their fear because it is then that they will see what they carry in their hearts, what they are truly made of.

There are times in life when it seems like the Lord has really forgotten about us and hope starts to fade. There is an inexplicable silence that obligates us to use everything we have got to stay afloat. The disciples ought to get to work; they are called to discover how to face the unexpected storms of life; they are forced to learn to save the ship. When we are confronted by fear and discouragement, we struggle to even recognize the presence of God when He finally does manifest himself.

If we look only at ourselves, we become dependent on the winds and can no longer pass through storms on the waters of life. The great thinker Romano Guardini wrote that the Lord "is always close, being at the root of our being. Yet we must experience our relationship with God between the poles of distance and closeness. By closeness we are strengthened, by distance we are put to the test" (Accettare se stessi, Brescia 1992, 71). Deacon Jerome Emmanuel

Matthew 14:22-33

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When

evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.'
