

Matthew's Gospel passage signifies the opening of the doors to the Gentiles and their inclusion in the community of faith. The Canaanite woman had the handicap of not being a Jew. She belonged to a nation that was not only pagan, but a long-time enemy of the chosen people of God. Yet she is crying out to Christ to save her daughter possessed by a devil. Totally convinced that Jesus can be of assistance in her hopeless situation she comes forward, kneels at his feet, and asks for her daughter to be cured, crying out: 'Take pity on me, Son of David.'

The woman's plea and the silence of Jesus speak powerfully to the contemporary audience. The liturgical language she employs teaches us how to speak in worship, while Jesus' silence addresses our own experience of suffering and the seeming deafness of God. In the end, the narrative is a powerful story of communion and the gracious response of God. As Christians we need to recover the depths of our own speech, grounded in Scripture as expressions of the grace of an inclusive God who teaches us how to speak and how to wait in faith.

This passage confronts us with our own tendency to cause conflict by promoting exclusiveness. Many of us are biased against people because their political or religious outlook differs from our own. This encounter between Christ and the Canaanite woman indicates that God has no favourites, and nobody is excluded from his company. His message was not the exclusive property of the Jewish people but the Good News to be shared among all peoples and nationalities. His whole mission is to break down barriers and to remove walls of division and prejudice between Jew and Gentile. God does not discriminate but welcomes all who believe in him, who ask for his mercy and seek to do his will.

Saint Mother Teresa said in an interview, "I see somebody dying, I pick him up. I find somebody hungry; I give him food. He can love and be loved. I do not look at his colour, I do not look at his religion. I do not look at anything. Every person whether he is Hindu, Muslim, or Buddhist, he is my brother, my sister."

Matthew 15:21-28

My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his

feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table." Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.
