Remembering to Forgive

The basic commandment of our Christian teaching is to love God and to love one another. Apart from this commandment, there is no obligation which Christ taught more forcefully than that of showing forgiveness. In actual circumstances of everyday life, forgiveness is more often talked about than put into practice because it is difficult and demanding and it takes great deal out of us. In any community differences brought about by thoughtless words, selfish actions and jealousy inevitably provoke clashes. As a nation we prefer to nurse old scores rather than reach out the hand of reconciliation.

In the light of eternity and the shortness of our span of life, harbouring old grudges is pointless. The great Christian cry of forgiveness which comes from the heart was first echoed on the hill of Calvary. What Jesus proclaimed in words from the cross, he had lived out in deeds. The purpose of his life and death was to win forgiveness for all people.

The forgiveness that we offer others is the indispensable condition which makes it possible to receive God's forgiveness and to meaningfully pray: 'Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us'. It is in pardoning that we are pardoned. Our failure to offer pardon means that we have forgotten God's goodness or have not fully appreciated the unconditional forgiveness we have received from him.

What is required is limitless forgiving and the ability to keep on loving even in the face of insults. If we are to be true channels of God's grace then Christ must be the standard by which we measure and shape our conduct.

Peter went up to Jesus and said, 'Lord, how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'Not seven, I tell you, but seventy-seven times. 'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a

king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time," he said "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me", he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said. "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.'
