The Fruitless Vineyard

In our life experience we experience sadness when we have done everything, we possibly could to help our loved ones but met with nothing but ingratitude. In the parable of the master who leased his vineyard to other farmers but in return receives nothing but pain and rejection. (Mt.21: 23-33) The parable is trying to tell us how God feels towards his people. In spite of all the love he has shown them, all he gets in return is utter ingratitude.

Now what sort of fruits did God expect from his people? We are not talking about grapes! We are talking about right living. Which of us would make so bold as to claim that we had made a full and adequate response to God's love, shown in and through Christ? Though God is loving to the point of foolishness, he does want to see a response from us, not for his own sake, but for ours. He wants to see us make use of the gifts and opportunities he has given us so that we can grow as his children. Our response must be free and given out of love.

Now is the time to start making a response. There is no point in waiting till the harvest time. That will be too late. Our response must be summed up like this: God wants us to live as Jesus his Son lived. Just as it takes many vines and many branches to make a vineyard, so also is a Christian community. This is the vineyard that Christ planted and tended with such care that he gave his life for it. He looks to his vineyard to produce the fruits of justice, love and peace. The vineyard can't be fruitful unless the individual vines are fruitful.

Someone has rightly said that the only thing in the long run is the meagre work of every day.

his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?

'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'
