In our conversation circles we say that two things cannot be avoided ie taxes and death. When Jesus says, 'Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and give to God what belongs to God', he challenges his critics to take their responsibility to God as seriously as their obligations to the state. While God and Caesar each have claim over us, neither allegiance should cancel out the other. The gospel reminds us that we are members of God's kingdom and citizens of a country, with obligations to both. As Christians we are not only members of the church but also members of society. Tensions can exist between our loyalty to God and our duty to our country especially when political questions touch upon faith and morality.

It is said that religion and politics should not be mixed but when crucial issues of conscience occasionally emerge, they seem to overlap. In these instances, we must put God and his laws first even if it brings us into conflict with the state. Abortion and care unto the end of life are examples. We are obliged to bring the gospel of Jesus into every aspect of our life. Loyalty to the general laws of the country need not contradict our obedience to God. A good Christian, by keeping his thoughts on heaven while having his feet firmly planted on earth, can love God and country and be faithful to both. Every person must show a proper interest in the well-being of society.

Every Christian is called to be a prophetic voice in an imperfect world. We need to respect the laws of the land and play our part in creating peace and concord in society and at the same time to be mindful of the commandments of God and act according to his will.

October - Month of the Holy Rosary

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. This is due to the fact that on October 7th the Church also celebrates the Marian advocation of "Our Lady of the Rosary". This feast was established by Pope St. Pius V in 1571 to celebrate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7th of that year. Prior to the decisive battle, St. Pius V requested all Western Christians to pray the rosary; thus he attributed the victory to the power of the Marian prayer rather than the power of ships and cannons.

We are all encouraged to pray the Rosary this month as Our Blessed Mother requested of us in her apparitions to the children of Fatima in 1917.

All Souls Day

All Souls' Day, also called *The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed* is a day of prayer and remembrance for the faithful departed, observed on 2 November. Through prayer, intercessions, alms and visits to cemeteries, people commemorate the poor souls in purgatory and gain them indulgences.

Masses will be celebrated for your dearly departed on 2 November at 9.15 and 7 pm. November Mass Offering envelopes are placed in the church. You may place the Mass offerings in a box which will be placed in front of the altar and celebrated through the month.
