

The Call to Repentance

The prophet Jonah and Mathew in his first chapter, both highlight the theme of repentance. Jonah, a reluctant Jewish prophet, was sent to preach repentance to the Ninevites, the sworn enemies of Israel. He is not enthusiastic for the job, and he dislikes God for squandering his mercy on the non-Jews. He prefers to see the city of Nineveh destroyed rather than its people converted, but God thought otherwise. These people are important to him and worth calling to repentance. To Jonah's intense annoyance, when he preached, the people mended their ways, and their city was spared. God's call to repentance is based on love and respect for us. It's an affirmation of our basic worth and pre-supposes that we are valuable. Unless we are gripped by that feeling of being worthwhile of God's love, we miss the point of the gospel's call to repentance.

The apostles responded the call of Jesus because they realised that something better was on offer. They sensed that Jesus was inviting them to a higher way of life, and they saw themselves, not as they were, but as they could be. To such an invitation there could only be one response: to repent and believe the Good News. Repentance is not as easy as it appears. There is more to it than saying extra prayers, doing a stint of fasting and being sorry for past sins. The gospel gives us a picture of what is involved in the process. Leaving our nets and disentangling ourselves from worldly pursuits to follow Jesus is not a one-off decision. It is an ongoing battle and challenge of a lifetime. We must constantly reassess our behaviour in the light of the gospel, and if need be, make a fresh start. There are no half measures in following Christ.

We need to repent and change our ways like the Ninevites. The story of Jonah speaks to us of our own closed minds and hardened attitudes. Through repentance, hatred and prejudice can be rooted out and shows us the path of tolerance. Deep down we know that we are not yet the people God is calling us to be. The good news is that God's loving mercy is available to all who repent, whoever they are, wherever they live and whatever they have done. By choosing to repent we change our lives.
