Comforter of the Afflicted

The grim pictures on social media of war, famine and children dying of starvation can shake the faith even of a saint. Our hearts would be of stone if we were not moved by a friend's accidental passing away or a little child struck with a life threatening illness. There is no understanding why good people are asked to suffer and carry such heavy crosses. People are forced to the conclusion that it is a punishment from God or that there is no God at all.

The Book of Job is an attempt to come to grips with the problem of human suffering. Job a good-living religious man is put to the test by God. He is stripped of his wife, family and all his possessions, and is finally struck down with illness. He is so overcome that he feels there is nothing to live for but misery. Job does not have an answer to catastrophe that he is experiencing. The truth is that there is no easy answer. Illness and death can be the most trying and important times of our life. Often, we neglect God until we are struck down in such a crisis. The challenge is to rise above our despair and to trust in him looking for his healing grace. There is no point in thinking what we might do if our circumstances were different.

When Jesus heals Simon's mother-in-law, he gives no reason as to why people suffer but he showed us the importance of turning suffering into joy. By identifying himself with the sick and the dying even to dying on the cross, Jesus clearly revealed that suffering is part of God's mysterious plan. We are invited to unite our trials and suffering with Christ to enjoy his victory. Whatever happens, all things will work together for those who love God and share in the passion of Christ. The gospel does not guarantee us freedom from suffering but gives us the assurance that God is with us however great our suffering may he.

Mark 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them. That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.
