Jesus the Healer

The gospel story of this weekend is about Jesus who moved with compassion, heals a leper. He is not afraid to reach out and touch the infected man. This is only one of the many personal encounters between Jesus and the sick people, where his compassion is so evident. It says something profound about the healer, as a font of mercy, and gives us an insight into God's caring approach to physical and spiritual sickness. Spiritual leprosy is a reality in every age. It's a sickness of the soul which cuts us off from God and is

much more serious because it remains invisible and goes unnoticed for a much longer time. However, the good news is that Jesus also stretches out his healing hand to bind up the wounds of all our sins.

It's a day to be mindful in our prayers for the people who are victims of diseases especially infectious in nature. Such people can be forgotten and ignored and left aside. What is often forgotten is that they are still people. Anyone who makes self-righteous statements such as 'serves them right' does not have the heart and mind of Christ.

By the very nature of our discipleship, the Lord sends us out to heal, reconcile and love unconditionally. God's power is in its kindness which reaches hearts in ways beyond explaining. While we might feel the pangs of moral outrage at the treatment received by lepers in the time of Christ, if the need arose could we be counted upon to bring healing and compassion to those struck by a dreaded disease?

Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.
