

**10 MARCH 2024** 



Reflection on John 3:14-21 (Fourth Sunday of Lent – Laetare Sunday)

(Established 1961)

One of the favorite parts of the text is "God so loved the world so much that he gave his only begotten Son". St. Augustine said, "God loves each of us as if we were His only child."

If you can you imagine a mother who has many children – say ten for example, "Each one is precious to her." A mother's love does not

operate on the principle of division. Her heart is not divided into ten ways. Rather, her love operates by the law of multiplication: one heart multiplied ten times. So, if you take a mother's love and multiply it by infinity, you will get a glimpse of the overwhelming love God has for each person on planet Earth. "For God so loved the world."

Yahweh is not the God of condemnation and destruction but the God of forgiveness, mercy and reconciliation. God is motivated by a love so great that he gives the world his only Son, not to destroy but to transform the world. Redemption begins with God; reconciliation and healing are God's work, filled with possibilities that are as limitless as they are undeserved. God's Messiah is the "Light" in which humankind sees the great love and mercy of God in their midst.

Jesus reveals a God of life and restoration, a God who seeks not our punishment or humiliation but our healing and reconciliation with Him and with one another. Too often, we approach faith as a series of "thou shall nots"- religion is equated with guilt, spirituality with that nagging little conscience in the depths of our souls that serves as a safety valve to stop us from becoming the wicked people we know we can become. Jesus challenges limited concept of faith: God is not a cosmic tyrant that revels in seeing us suffer; God has revealed himself as a loving Father of a perfect creation that has made itself imperfect in so many ways through sin.

Let us then look at Jesus lifted up on the cross and in glory. Let us see the unconditional abundant love of God for us shown there. Let us open our hearts to that love and let it flow right through us to bring life and hope to those with whom we come in contact – a friend or a foe.

**Second Reading:** Ephesians 2:4-10


When we were dead through sins, he brought us to life.

### **GOSPEL**

John 3:14-21



'The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have

eternal life in him. Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son. On these grounds is sentence pronounced: that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil. And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.

Memory is 26 years old and lives in rural Malawi. As the eldest child in a low-income farming family, Memory had to take on many household chores and farming activities to support her parents. They struggled to pay for Memory's school fees and school supplies, and Memory often had to walk to school barefooted.

With the support of Caritas Australia and its partner the Catholic Development Commission in Malawi (CADECOM), Memory was able to enrol at a technical college where she learnt technical skills in carpentry. She undertook a three-year carpentry course, with CADECOM supporting part of her tuition and boarding fees.

Memory became the first female carpenter from her village. Today, she works as a carpenter at one of Malawi's largest hydroelectric power stations. With the income from her job, she can provide financial support to her family and inspire other young women in her community so that they may have the opportunity to succeed in a male-dominated industry.
