## 18th Sunday, Ordinary Time - YEAR B August 4th 2024

(Established 1961)

Reflection on John 6: 24-35 (18<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time – Liturgical Year B)

In this Sunday's pericope from John's "bread of life" discourse Jesus is apparently speaking to two groups — those who witnessed the miracle of the loaves (last Sunday's Gospel) and those who did not see the miracle but have heard about it and demand to see a similar sign. To the former- those are the ones who saw the feeding miracle as an end in itself, rather than as the sign it was meant to be, something that pointed them to faith in the living God and in the Son whom God had sent. Jesus tells them that there is something much deeper in this event than "perishable food" being multiplied; the real "food" is the word of God proclaimed, its power and authority manifested in the miracles of the loaves.

To the latter group who seek a sign as the Israelites sought a sign from Moses, Jesus reminds them that it was not Moses himself but God working through Moses that provided their "grumbling" Exodus ancestors with bread in the desert. Jesus gives them a lesson in interpreting the Bible.

The subject of the sentence he says, is not Moses, but God. The ambiguous explication in verse thirty-two, "it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven" is resolved in verse thirty-five, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

"The reactions of the Israelites are often our own when we are faced with new challenges and unknown situations. We prefer to retreat; we prefer our addictions and habits even though they may have kept us in bondage. Instead of surrendering to God, we let our desires and the past control our lives.

God has given his people new bread for the new covenant – the Risen Christ.

The most difficult challenge of our time is to accomplish the "work" of God while "working" to establish and succeed in our careers, to make a place in our homes and hearts for the "bread" that is Christ amid the "fast food" being shoved in our faces from every direction. May God give us the wisdom to live lives grounded in the "food that endures" beyond the fleeting and perishable, the "bread" of God that feeds and nurtures us for our own "great adventure" to the dwelling place of the Father.

In the Eucharist we celebrate, we will share the bread of life – we practice an economy of sharing which hopefully will overflow towards our daily lives.

## **TAP & GO DONATION UPDATE**

<u>Please note:</u> The 3G network is scheduled to be phased out soon. The existing Quest (the tap & go) donation devices, which rely on 3G SIM cards to process donations, have been replaced with Smart devices.

There are two Smart devices installed in the Church and ready for use. These terminals allow parishioners to tap a donation or payment using their Master or Visa card. It comes with a Donation App which allows three pre-set amounts (\$ 5, 10, 20). There is also an 'Other Amount' button allowing the donor to donate an amount of their own choice.

Please select the amount you wish to donate and then tap your Master or Visa Card to complete the process. Only two steps – it is that simple. In case you need assistance, our Parish Priest (or Deacon) will be on hand.
