## Reflection, 2nd Sunday of Advent, Ordinary Time, Year C—Advent Candle, PEACE

Second Sunday of Advent- Call to Prayer and Repentance If Christmas is going to be a deeply religious experience and not just a season of merriment, the season of Advent has got to be taken seriously and not robbed of its meaning.

The days leading up to Christmas are a time of hope and renewal providing us with an opportunity for strengthening and deepening our union with Christ through repentance for which John the Baptist calls us beyond simple confession of wrongdoings. He gives us some practical advice to smooth a passageway for Christ by pointing out obstacle and barriers that need to be removed from our hearts.

Among the valleys to be filled in are the good we meant to do and never got around to doing, our neglect of family and neighbours and those wasted opportunities for helping others, not forgetting the mountains of pride which can only be levelled out by the daily practice of being humble. John is speaking an uncomfortable truth, challenging us about our behaviours which can be found wanting and inviting us to clear the pathways for God and conduct ourselves better and humbly ask Jesus for his light to guide us. Those pockets of silence every day, moments when we are alone are opportunities to turn to God in silent prayer which can sharpen our ability to hear God's word and enjoy the blessings that he wants to pour out

Advent is a time of waiting for God, calling us home, offering us salvation. On the first Christmas Day, he entered our world and opened the door to peace. Through prayer and repentance, let us ask the Spirit to lead us through that doorway thus to be found watchful and at peace with God and one another.

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert.

John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

#### **2025 JUBILEE YEAR**

As we make our way through Advent and into the 2025 Jubilee Year, you might be wondering...

"What is a 'Jubilee Year' and why is it important?"

Moses established a law that <u>every fifty years society would get a</u> <u>"reboot,"</u> giving freedom to slaves, granting forgiveness to captives, and restoring families to their rightful inheritance. Although Israel consistently failed to keep this generational "reboot," they looked to the

promised Messiah to fulfill this Year of Jubilee.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus interprets the words of the prophet Isaiah in relation to the Jubilee as applying to Himself (cf. Lk 4:16-21), thus announcing the appearance of the long-awaited Messiah who would grant forgiveness to captives, set slaves free, and restore families to their inheritance. This "Year of Jubilee" that was mandated by Moses and fulfilled in Jesus is carried on in His Church today.
