## Easter- A Way Forward Out of Darkness

There is no day to compare with Easter Day. It stands out from the conflicts and turmoil of our broken world, lifts our minds and enlivens our hearts with joy and love so complete that it conquers death. Early in the morning a mighty act of God took place - Christ rose from the dead, altered the past and shaped the future.

Nothing can be the same again. All our hopes and happiness stem from that event. Easter announces that transformation is possible, and change can take place in our lives.

The resurrection of Jesus from the dead affirms that death is not the end of us. Human life is no longer limited by the cycle of birth and death.
