Reflection; 3rd Sunday of Easter

Jesus asks Simon Peter three times – Do you love me? Simon, son of John, do you love me? What a strange question to ask: 'Do you love me?' Had not he proved beyond any shadow of doubt that he did not love him? Yet this is the question Jesus asked Peter. And Peter said, 'Lord, you know that I love you.' He sincerely meant those words. What is more – they were true.

He really did love Jesus. Jesus knew that there was another and better side to Peter. Strength and weakness can co-exist in the same person. Jesus asked Peter to declare his love in public, since his denial had also been in public. Jesus is now offering Peter three chances to redeem himself. Jesus kept no record of Peter's sins. But he did ask him to do something for him - to feed the sheep and lambs of his flock, that is, to love and serve his brothers and sisters in the community.

And he also learned a wonderful truth about Jesus. He learned that in spite of his denials, Jesus still loved him. It was that love that brought Peter back to life. It is an amazing experience to be loved in one's weakness and sinfulness. To be loved in one's goodness is no big deal. But to be loved in one's badness – that is tremendous. That is what grace is about.

Peter's story is one of calling, falling, and re-calling. It shows that Christ's call does not exclude falls. A vocation is not something one hears once and answers once. The call has to be heard many times and responded to many times. Each day a part of the chosen path opens up before us, a part we have not trodden before. As one goes on, the call gets deeper, and response becomes more interior and more personal.

Just as Peter recognises the risen Lord and leaps into the waters, so Christians profess their Faith in the risen Jesus and are baptized in water and the Spirit. Just as the first disciples share a meal with the risen Jesus, so we now regularly share the Eucharist with Him. And just as the risen Jesus commissions Peter to undertake a pastoral mission on his behalf, so the natural consequence of Baptism and the Eucharist for us is to share ourselves and our Faith with others.

All vocations are vocation to love – love of the Lord, and love of the lambs and sheep of his flock, who are our brothers and sisters in the community.

Gospel John 21:1-19

At that time, Jesus revealed himself to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples.

Simon Peter said to them, ""I am going fishing."" They said to him, ""We also will come with you."" So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, ""Children, have you caught anything to eat?"" They answered him, ""No.""

So he said to them, ""Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something.""

So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, ""It is the Lord.""

When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, ""Bring some of the fish you just

So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish.

Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, ""Come, have breakfast."" And none of the disciples dared to ask him, ""Who are you?"" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the
