Reflection; St. Peter and St. Paul

The significant moments in the life of Jesus were told and retold in the early Church. Peter's recognition of Jesus' messiahship proved to be one of those significant moments. Jesus asks his disciples as to who do they say he is?

Peter makes his complete confession of faith: 'You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God'. Matthew has elaborated on Luke's simpler 'the Christ of God' (see Lk 9:20) and in doing so Jesus is presented as the Son of Man, the Christ and the Son of God (vv. 13-16). It is on this belief that the Church is founded, but a belief made visible in Peter. Faith is not an idea. It is lived by people; it forms a Church.

Peter is the rock upon which the Church is built (v. 18). His faith is the basis of a journey through a long history and many cultures. Peter is also the teacher, the one who holds the keys, binding and loosing, interpreting authoritatively God's ways in the world (v. 19).

But none of this is because of Peter himself. The fact that there was a Peter, and that today we still have a Peter, in the person of the Pope, is a gift of God. It was neither ordinary human experience nor the human intellect which inspired Peter. It was not his flesh and blood: 'Simon, son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven' (v. 17). It was the Father of Jesus who gifted him in this unique way. By telling Peter that he is a 'happy man' Jesus tells him that he has been specially favoured. He did not merit or earn such blessings.

St. Paul who considers himself as the least of the apostles, has won for himself the crown of righteousness through his deepseated faith in the risen Lord and proclaiming his message fearlessly and tirelessly to all the communities he visited. Through his teaching and preaching, he brought many people closer to God and one another, thus strengthening the church. The Church will always be tempted to counter the political power structures of the world by responding in kind. This must not happen. Our faith is a gift of God, our Church is a gift of God, our leadership is a gift of God. Let us keep these truths clearly in mind lest we think the great gifts of our faith, our Church and its leadership can be manipulated into yet another power structure, following the ways of flesh and blood.
